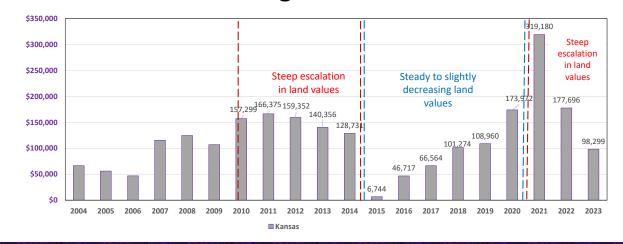
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## What is going on in the Ag. Land market?

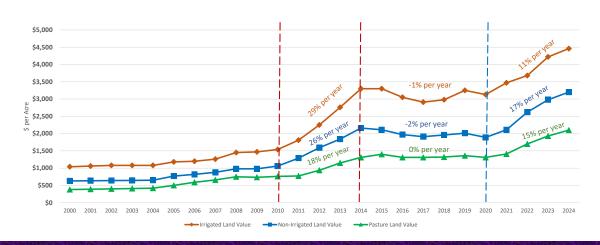
- Farm Income was historically strong fueling large increases in land value
  - High commodity prices + gov. payments during COVID = Escalating land prices
  - Current farm profitability uncertain
- Interest rates historically high
- Are agricultural land values at a tipping point?

## Net Farm Income – Kansas Farm Management Association



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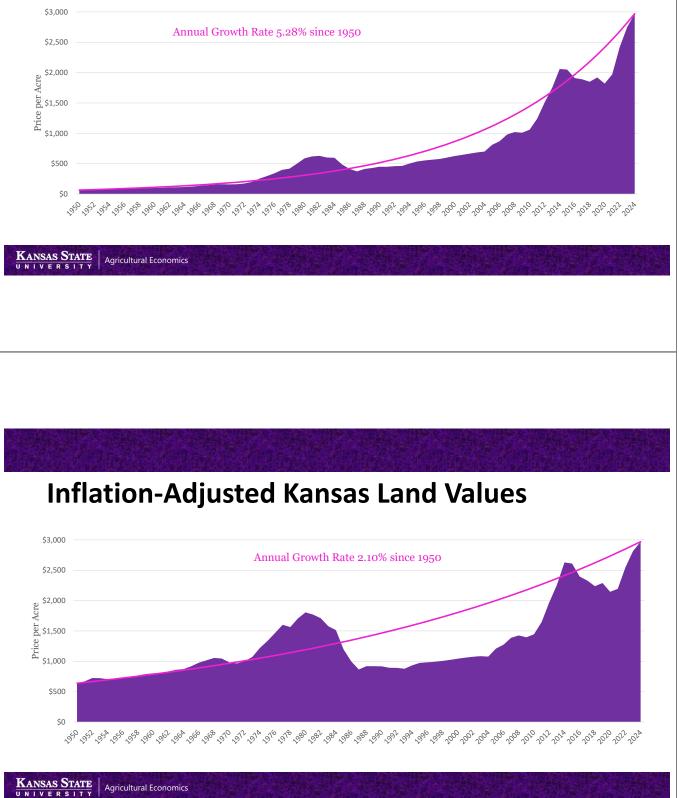

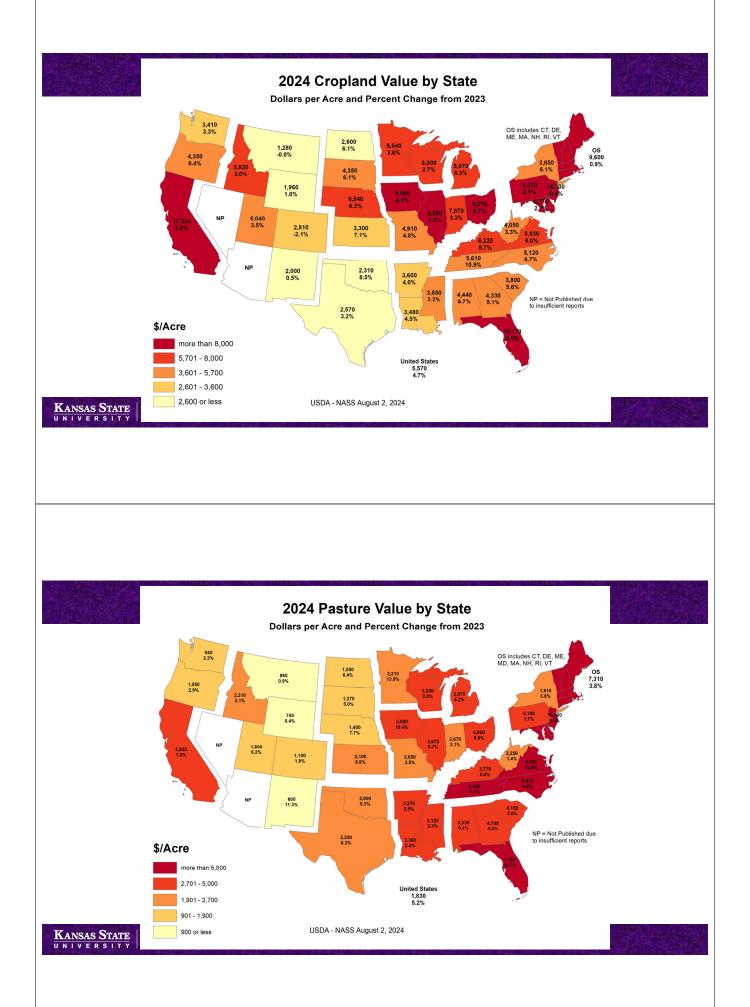

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## **Market-based Land Values**

- Source for market transaction data
  - Property Valuation Division-Kansas Dept. of Revenue
- 2015-23 actual sales data (not survey)
  - County location
  - Acres in sale
  - Mixture of irrigated, non-irrigated and pasture in parcel
  - Value of improvements are removed for bare land value

2023 Book is based on Q4 of 2022 and Q1-Q3 of 2023 2024 Book will be published in Jan. 2025

## Where will land values go from here?

- · Crop margins expected to remain tight in coming years
  - Lower cash rents? Flattening of cropland prices? Lowering cropland prices?
- Cattle prices historically high right now
  - Adds support for pasture prices in the short run
  - When will cowherd expansion occur and beef prices come down?
- What about hunting/recreational interest?
  - Will the general economy remain strong?
- How about investors?
  - Are there better returns elsewhere?

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## What ownership trends are we seeing in Kansas?

- · Baby boomer generation of farmers are retiring
- Significant amounts of land will be changing hands
  - Inheritance by off-farm heirs
  - Sales
- Who is purchasing farmland?
  - Other farmers
  - Local non-farming folks with income unrelated to ag
  - Out of state hunters
  - Investors

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## Who owns Kansas Farmland?

- KS Landowner database (2015)
- Only ag. parcels over 40 acres
  - Represents 95% of all ag. land acres in Kansas (47 mil. of 49 mil. Acres)
- Comparing county that parcel is located in to city, state, zip code of landowner

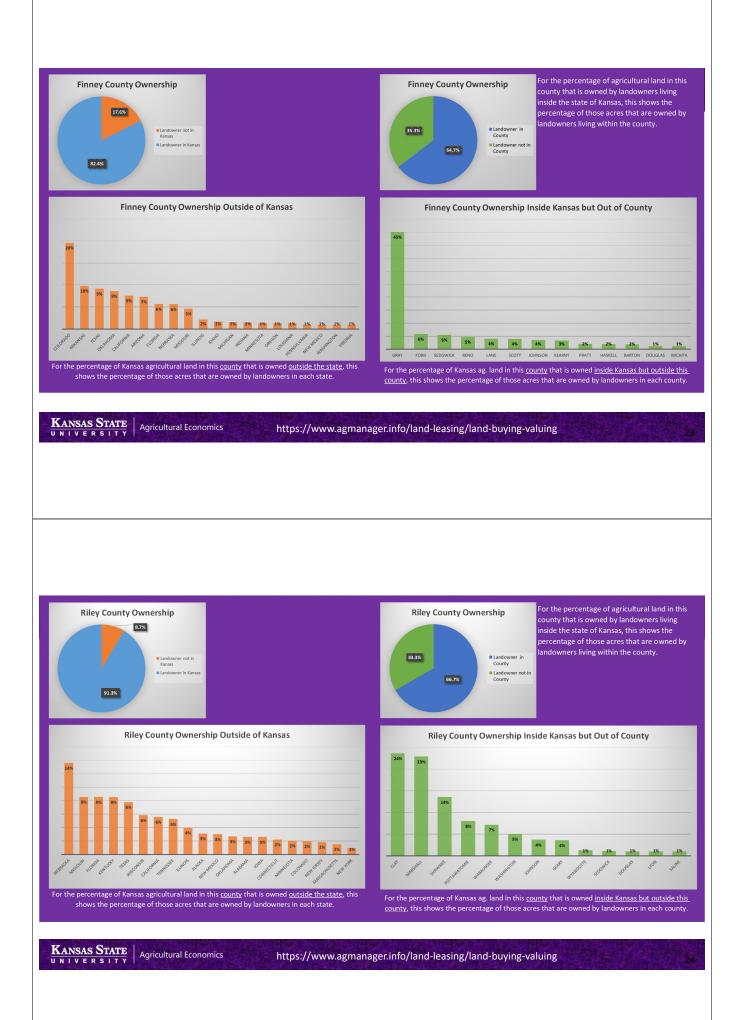

## What has changed since 2015?

- Significant amount of land has changed hands (zip codes)
- More land has shifted to out-of-state ownership
  - Texas residents owning Kansas farm/ranchland continues to increase
- Pasture/Grass acres are driving the shift to more out-of-state ownership

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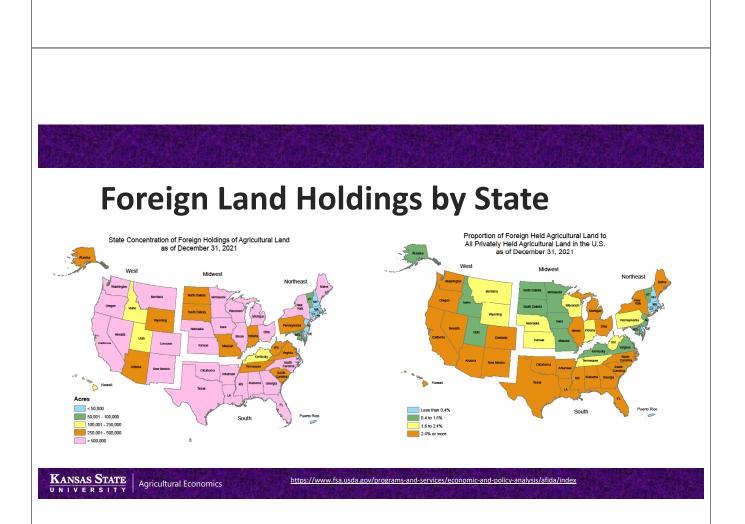
## **National Summary of Foreign-Holdings**

- Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act of 1978 (AFIDA)
  FSA-153
- Foreign investors held approximately 40 million acres of U.S. Ag. Land in 2021

• This represents 3.1% of all privately owned land Ag. land in the U.S.

- Increase of 2.4 million acres from the 2020 report
  - Has been increasing nearly 2.2 million acres annually since 2015
  - From 2009 to 2015, yearly increase averaged 0.8 million acres

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## Kansas

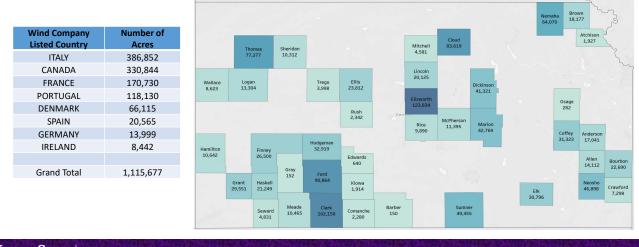
- Privately held Ag. Land totals 49,188,971 acres
- Of those, 1,187,690 acres are Foreign "held" (2.4%)

- Of the Foreign "Holdings":
  - 1,115,677 acres are Wind Energy company leases
    94% of reported foreign held acres
  - 4,297 acres are Solar Energy company leases
  - 67,717 acres remaining are primarily ag. use (cropland & pasture)

## Why is this potentially an issue?
