










SHOCK #3 Consumer Meat Demand

- Recession
- ➤ Weaker Meat Demand (typically at least)
- Stimulus & Spending
- ➤ Supports Demand (April incomes were up!)
- **►**VERY divergent consumer spending

 - **GT:** this is perhaps currently the most important relationship in the industry






Ongoing Evolution....

Fed Slaughter Capacity Utilization

Vs. Monday-Friday Packing Capacity



"Too many cattle relative to capacity" - Wider beef-cattle \$ difference

"Too much capacity relative to cattle"
-Narrower beef-cattle \$ difference






Ongoing Evolution....

Also note PHYSICAL Capacity is NOT OPERATIONAL Capacity





 - Many other announcements






- Jargon-free distinction:
 - Price Discovery: process of buyers & sellers arriving at a transaction price
 - Price Levels: determined market price reflects interaction of broad supply & demand forces





"Confusion" & "Increased Interest" correlates with periods of lower farm prices



Understanding Market Prices




Price discovery and price determination are not the same thing. But both affect the value of your calves. You can affect the physical attributes of your calves by your breeding, cow management and calf handling programs. You choose when calves will be marketed, in what size groups and by what marketing method. Calf prices some years are \$90/cwt. and some years \$120/cwt. In a \$90 market, some producers








- •MANY sound economic reasons fed cattle marketing practices have evolved



Traceability

- 1. Lots of commentary on consumers "wanting to know more"
- 2. GT agrees, but thinks RELATIVE context is important







Traceability

- 1. Livestock traceability must reflect consumer interest AND inner-supply chain motives
- 2. Voluntary traceability programs operate with an implicit market & cost-share policies may offer an alternative to gov't mandates

Role of International Trade Is Complex & Often Misunderstood...

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SUMMARY of GT's Views 4 KS Growth

- 1. KS has valuable opportunity given presence of all major stages of beef-cattle industry
- 2. Business-friendly approach required
 - □ 100% of \$10 versus 10% of \$1,000
- 3. Forward-looking approach aligned with consumer-demand required
 - Domestic AND Export
 - Domestic Retail vs. Domestic Food Service
